I. Third Budget Presentation

Dr. Lutinski began by informing the community that the last budget presentation is scheduled for 9 a.m. on May 8th at Daniel Warren, and the budget vote is scheduled for May 21st from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. in the MS/HS Community Room. He then reviewed the budget goals which are a commitment to favorable class size, a tax cap compliant budget, maximizing efficiencies in scheduling and personnel, strategic planning, extracurricular opportunities, and a continued breadth and depth of core course offerings. He stated that the proposed budget is \$51,127,223, which is a 2.19% tax levy increase and will be at the tax levy cap. In addition, the projected enrollment for 2024-25 is 1,461.

Next, Mrs. Mahar reviewed proposed revenues, the largest amount coming from property taxes (\$43,459,590), then estimated State aid (\$5,192,633). She explained the components of the tax cap and tax cap calculation - this is the thirteenth consecutive year of tax cap compliant budgets. With regard to the State Aid estimates, Mrs. Mahar stated that Foundation Aid is the largest category (\$3,665,676) and reviewed the ten year Foundation Aid history.

With regard to expenses, Mrs. Mahar advised that salaries and benefits are the largest part of the budget totaling \$37,523,651 or 73.39%. She advised that active and medicare health insurance rates are increasing by a composite rate of 10.05%. Employer retirement system contributions are also increasing from 9.76% to 10.02% for TRS and from 13.10% to 15.20% for ERS. Additionally, the District is allocating \$350,000 to capital improvements, renovations and upgrades to the high school entrance and the temporary

parking lot and bike/walking path at the Middle/High School, \$80,000 for the installation of window security film, and \$59,000 for the replacement of the ceiling in the Daniel Warren lower lever.

Dr. Lutinski then reviewed the staffing changes for next year. The District will be adding 3.7 positions and losing 4.7 positions which is a \$28,355 impact on the budget. In addition, he advised that a new \$30,000 budget line has been added to support the Strategic Plan and provide additional professional development opportunities for staff which include a permanent building sub to allow teachers to attend professional development opportunities during the school day.

Next, Mrs. Mahar explained the factors which influence the tax rate change, including changes in the budget, in equalization and in assessments. She reported that the draft 2024-25 tax rate changes are +7.99% for Rye City and -5.43% for Rye Town. Community members can calculate their estimated school taxes using the Tax Rate Calculator on the website.

Finally, Mrs. Mahar reviewed Proposition II - Use of the Capital Reserve Fund. It is anticipated that the balance of the Capital Reserve Fund will be \$2,700,000 on June 30, 2024. Its use does not require any additional levying of taxes, but to use the money for project work, the District needs voter authorization. The District would like to use the money to complete some of the work from the 2022 Building Condition Survey which identified all immediate and future building and site work. Mrs. Mahar then reviewed the specific work that needs to be performed at each building and stated that the estimated cost is \$2,700,000 - the amount in the Capital Reserve Fund.

II. Opening of Meeting

President Mansell called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

III. President's Report

President Mansell began by reporting that the Board will be approving the 2024-2025 proposed budget, another tax-cap compliant budget that prioritizes valuable programs and experiences for students and staff. She reminded the community to come out and vote on May 21st to approve the budget, the use of the capital reserve funds, and to elect two members of the board. Anyone interested in running can pick up a nominating packet in the district office. Completed petitions are due by 4 p.m. on Monday, April 22nd. Even though school is not in session, the district office will be open.

Next, President Mansell stated that students in grades three through eight sat for the New York State English Language Arts exam last week. Third and fourth graders took paper and pencil tests, while fifth through eighth graders took computer-based tests. Although participation in the exams increased from last year, it was still not 100%. She urged all eligible students to take next month's New York State Mathematics test since these assessments help the staff understand how well students are meeting the New York State Next Generation standards. Participation rates also impact the district's rating on New York State accountability reports. Any questions can be directed to the building principals.

IV. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Lutinski began by reporting that he attended last week's High School Research Symposium where he got to talk with some of the Science Research and Independent Learner Program students. He is continually impressed with the depth of knowledge and level of articulation the students command. He also visited afterschool Binary Bingo, where High School students ran math games for Middle School students. In addition, kindergartners visited the Westchester Children's Museum, the 3rd grade will visit the NY Hall of Science, the 7th grade saw *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, many of the seniors have begun their Senior Internships, and the senior class were the victors on Junior-Senior Day last week.

Dr. Lutinski then stated that it is the beginning of the 4th quarter and students will continue their busy pace throughout the final 41 class days left in the school year. First graders are preparing for their Earth Day Concert this Friday, the K-5 Art Show will take place at F.E. Bellows, both the Middle and High School are preparing for their Spring Concerts, the Middle School will be performing *Matilda Jr.*, and all levels of sports are taking place. Additionally, the PTSA Panther Party will be taking place on April 27th, the Booster Club Spring Spirit BBQ on May 4th, and the Rye Neck School Foundation kick-off event on May 6th.

6. Modification of Senior Citizens Tax Exemption Income Definition

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Rye Neck Union Free School District has adopted resolutions in past years with respect to tax abatements of real property taxes in accordance with enabling legislation enacted by the State Legislatures; and

WHEREAS, as Part K of Chapter 59 of the Laws of 2023, the New York State Legislature amended the senior citizens exemption (RPTL §467) and the exemption for persons with disabilities and limited incomes (RPTL §459-c) in three respects (1) it redefined what is considered income for purposes of the exemptions; (2) it clarifies which income tax year applies when determining income eligibility; and (3) it replaces gender-specific language with gender-neutral language; and

WHEREAS, the new definition of income begins with the Federal Adjusted Gross Income ("FAGI") and allows for five possible adjustments; and

WHEREAS, local municipal entities have the option to include IRA distributions in the calculation of FAGI; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Rye Neck Union Free School District finds it in the public interest to adopt a resolution pursuant to Part K of Chapter 59 of the Laws of 2023 including taxable IRA distributions in the calculation of FAGI. It was

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Rye Neck Union Free School District hereby modifies the definition of income with regard to the senior citizens exemption and the exemption for persons with disabilities and limited incomes to be the Federal Adjusted Gross Income reported on the applicant's income tax return and such FAGI shall include any taxable IRA distributions as authorized by Chapter 59 of the Laws of 2023, wherein State Legislatures amended Sections 459-c, and 467 of the Real Property Tax Law; and it was

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any gendered language contained within be replaced with gender-neutral language, i.e., "husband and wife" shall be replaced by "married couple"; and it was

FURTHER RESOLVED, that when determining income eligibility for Sections 459-c and 467, the applicable tax year shall be the latest calendar year (e.g., for 2024 exemption eligibility, an applicant's 2023 income is used); and it was

FURTHER RESOLVED, that such amendment shall become effective with the 2024 assessment rolls.

Student Senate Secretary Lily Mansell reported that the Senate had their last meeting of the school year this week. Last week, they sponsored an Ice Cream Social, and celebrated Junior/Senior Day. They met with Mr. Doerr regarding the school's safety policies, and the High School Spring Concert is taking place tomorrow night. Upcoming events are AP exams and the Prom.

PTSA - Ruth Homberg

PTSA President Ruth Homberg reported that the Panther Party will be held on April 27th and will kick off with a Fund Run on the Middle/High School track. There will be four food trucks, an inflatable ninja course, soccer activities, sewing activities, an international bake sale, a children's book sale, an origami party, an art party, a game party, lawn games, crafts, student performances, a DJ, and a variety of raffles. In addition, the Mamaroneck Police Department will be hosting a bike rodeo, the Fire Department will have a truck for children to explore, and Rye Neck apparel will be on sale.

Next, Mrs. Homberg advised that Daniel Warren and F.E. Bellows are in the middle of Walk/Bike/Scoot to School Week. Someone from the Westchester Department of Transportation came to speak with the students last week about bike/pedestrian safety awareness. Students are invited to bring pieces of nature they find on their way to school this week to create living murals; the committee heads organized a bike helmet decorating activity; and students were encouraged to write appreciation notes to the crossing guards.

In addition, Kickball Night is scheduled for Thursday evening at F.E. Bellows, and Daniel Warren's Family Fitness Night took place at the end of March. Spring after-school clubs started last Tuesday. New clubs offered this session include cooking, woodworking, scratch game design and French for Native Speakers.

Mrs. Homberg then reported that since the last meeting the PTSA organized and funded a few STEAM events. The Shakespeare Company of New Jersey put on performances for grades 7 and 9; Mobile Ed brought their Pop Up Planetarium to Daniel Warren; Steven Goldberg talked with the Middle/High School about "Symbols of Hate"; the NED show presented at F.E. Bellows regarding character education; Rye Neck teacher Kathie Offner spoke to 10th graders about her family's experience during the Holocaust; and on April 30th, author Veera Hiranandani will have a virtual presentation with F.E. Bellows students.

Lastly, Mrs. Homberg stated that they had the final SEAC speaker of the year on April 9th; there was a Heard in Rye talk about the Emotional Lives of Teenagers last night; and the final General Membership meeting of the year will be held on May 9th.

Booster Club - Jocelyn Donat

Booster Club President Jocelyn Donat reported that the Booster Club launched the scholarship applications for senior athletes and thespians, and sold concessions and spirit wear at the Pantherpalooza track meet. In addition, they will be providing signs for senior athletes; supporting coaches in purchasing small gifts for senior athletes; selling spirit wear in conjunction with the PTSA at the Panther Party; hosting the Spring Barbeque for athletes on May 4th; contributing to the Middle School Dance; and providing blankets for senior athletes at the Sports Awards Ceremony.

RNTA - Mark Lauten

RNTA Representative Mark Lauten reported with the start of the fourth quarter there are many big milestones for teachers and students. In the elementary schools, all students attended the NED Mindset Mission Assembly; the 4th graders have a trip coming up to the NY Hall of Science and the 5th grade have a trip to the Bronx Zoo; the PTSA is sponsoring a kickball game at F.E. Bellows; and author Veera Hiranandani will speak to students about her work. In the Middle School, the STEM Club began work on building robotics. In the High School, the Research Symposium was held in the Collaborative Science Center; the third quarter was finished off with a Senate ice cream social; and Junior/Senior day took place on Friday.

In addition, 5th grade students have started visiting the Middle School in preparation for next year's transition and parents attended the Incoming 6th Grade Orientation; seniors have started their internships; and preparation has begun for the 8th Grade Moving Up Ceremony, High School Graduation, and Prom.

Finally, Mr. Lauten stated that the April 8th solar eclipse brought the district together in a positive way and prompted all sorts of lessons and watch parties across the district.

RNSF - Jen Soussa

RNSF President Jen Soussa explained that the RNSF is a 501c3 corporation, created for the sole purpose of funding innovative and state of the art projects and programs that are not covered by the school district's operating budget. She is a board of director, along with Jaime Santa, Nikki Barker and Debra Cunningham. Erica Wagner serves as the BOE liaison. She stated that each year, the RNSF will accept grant applications from administrators, teachers and HS students to fund projects and initiatives that enhance the educational, artistic and athletic experiences of Rye Neck students. There will be two types of grant applications – Insta-grants, which are intended to fund smaller scale items capped at \$2,500, such as books, supplemental teacher materials, flexible furniture or new equipment for a classroom. Funds for these types of applications will be awarded on a quarterly basis and used within the current school year. They will also accept traditional grant applications for larger scale items valued at over \$2,500. These applications will be accepted and awarded once per year and are intended to be implemented within the following school year. Traditional grants can fund a wide range of initiatives, including pilot programs, playground enhancements, sports field and fitness renovations, technology improvements, etc.

Next, Mrs. Soussa reported that in order to pay for these opportunities, the RNSF will be holding several fundraisers throughout the year. As part of the launch, they are currently running two fundraising campaigns – the Golden Ticket Raffle and our Panther Paver Brick Project. The Golden Ticket Raffle is open until May 6th or until tickets sell out and entrants have the chance to win a 7-night accommodation to one of four destinations of the winner's choice - Orlando, FL, Lake Tahoe, NV, Steamboat Springs, CO or Blue Ridge Mountains, NC. Raffle tickets are \$100 and only 100 tickets in total are being sold. The winner will be announced at the RNSF's "Get to Know Us" event, which is a free event open to the community on May 6th at 25 North Restaurant from 6:30-8:30 p.m. All community members are encouraged to stop by for complimentary hors devours and drinks and to learn more about the foundation.

The second fundraising campaign is the Panther Paver Brick Project, which is open until June 1. They are selling inscribed brick pavers, the first 300 of which will line the gardens at the main entrance of the High School. They plan to work with the administration on an annual basis to expand the brick project to other locations throughout the HS campus and at the other schools.

Trustee Carmel reported that the committee met on January 25th and will be meeting again on May 14th with the external auditors for the annual kick-off meeting for the 2024 audit. In addition, they will be meeting with the internal auditor to discuss the risk assessment report and the special review project for 2024-2025.

Policy Committee

Trustee Nashelsky reported that the Board will be adopting three new policies and will be having a first read of four new policies during New Business. The next Policy Committee meeting is scheduled for May 9th.
