Superintendent's Update

November 2023

Dear Rye Neck Families,

November is here and the Daylight Saving change brings darkness much earlier. There was a proposed change last year to end the twice-annual shift and make the measure permanent (darker in the morning, lighter in the evening), but although it passed in the U.S. Senate it was not voted on by the House.



Pros and cons of DST depend on where you live and what you do. For schools, the primary effect is that there is more afterschool daylight for athletics and recreation. However, the period of November to March and the earlier darkness it brings is a good time to remember safe commuting habits. For our students who attend late extracurricular activities and may be going home on foot, by bicycle, or driving a car, and for our staff and parents who drive to and from campus, now is the time to reaffirm our attention to rules of the road.

Rye Neck Strategic Plan

Our Strategic Planning initiative is well underway. Students and staff members have had opportunities to weigh in via survey and our parent surveys were sent out earlier. 


